

Fighting Fire with Flames of the Spirit

Recently, First Presbyterian and I came under vigorous media and phone attack by people as far away as Australia because we opened our doors to Planned Parenthood and neighborhood women back in March. Groups affiliated with the Archdiocese of New Orleans had been threatening not only the health clinic that is being built by Planned Parenthood down the street from us, but

even the construction workers and contractors--their livelihoods and their families. So we hosted a rally in our sanctuary at the same time the construction site was under siege by protesters.

This health clinic is desperately needed by poor and minority women (some of whom are undocumented) who have no where else to turn for all kinds of health care and testing.

But this is only the background. It's my reaction to all the hate and the rhetoric and chaos in the light of the apostles experience after Jesus' resurrection that I want to share. I should have learned from their example. They, of course, had the proverbial 'Upper Room Experience" where Jesus gifted them--all of them--with the Holy Spirit that we will celebrate soon at Pentecost. They went from being scared, unsure and confused; to bonded together, incisive and absolutely convinced of God's power in their lives and the lives of everyone else. Outside that room they had much to fear. The populace was stirred up, and the apostle's speeches just made the people worse.

I, on the other hand, confronted with a modern version of a mob assault on the upper room, gave over to fighting fire with fire in a few cases, writing vituperative responses to asinine attacks...which made absolutely no change in the mobs and left me angry and empty. That is when I started reading Acts more closely and tried another tack. The Apostles didn't let the haters off the hook, but they didn't fight sin with sin. They made positive changes; even though the menace was still there, they reacted by healing and performing miracles, teaching and doing many of the things that Jesus had done.

We need to stand up to hate, lies and willful misunderstanding wherever it is found, but counter it with firmness of faith, the truth, and trust that "Good is stronger than evil; love is stronger than hate; light is stronger than darkness; life is stronger than death. Victory is ours, through him who loves us." (Desmond Tutu)

KITCHEN RENOVATION (Final Payment)



Project Homecoming has submitted their final invoice for the kitchen renovation. The only thing that hadn't been completed was mounting the sink to the wall. That was pending a \$500.00 change order that would add a stainless steel back splash behind the sink. Zane Fisher and Ken Allen negotiated the installation of the backsplash which Project Homecoming supplied and

installed at their expense. The backsplash was installed on Friday, June 26, 2015.

Refrigerator

Eric, one of Carrie and Zane Fisher's neighbor, an expert in kitchen renovation and who also owned a restaurant, came to the meeting to talk about commercial refrigerators. He was presented with 5 commercial refrigerators that Chris Roberts found were within our budget and he gave us his recommendation, which happened to be the cheapest one. Eric recommended that we go to Restaurant Depot to check and see if they could match the price or better.

Chris met with Eric on Friday, June 19th to walk through the kitchen. Eric inspected the kitchen and gave some recommendations. He said the stove is fine, it just needs a good cleaning; there was a hood vent in the past and the electrical hookups were still there; the remaining wooden baseboard around the kitchen would have to be replaced with rubber baseboard; the non-stainless steel tabletop in the kitchen is fine but the wooden top needs to be removed.

Stairs

Fred Powell has spoken with Eddie Ramos (who repaired the pew in the sanctuary) about the stairs. Eddie is putting together an estimate. He also said they there was termite damage under the stairs, which is being handled by our exterminator.

Fellowship Hall Floor

Repairing the floor was discussed. It would have to be addressed after the termite treatment has been completed.
