# Where y'at, Preacher? Church on the Move

#### **March Madness**

"For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" 1 CORINTHIANS 1:18
"The LORD said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live" NUMBERS 21:8

A few months ago I was approached by someone after church who was puzzled about what he saw us do with bread and wine. For him it was as bizarre as the first time I saw people repeatedly clapping round wooden wedges to their foreheads then throw them on the floor in a Thai temple.



I recounted Jesus' breaking the bread and sharing the cup and how it fit in with Jesus' death, and most importantly, Jesus' resurrection and his assurances of our own life after death. My new friend asked, laughing "Is that just literature that you have to read, or do you actually believe it happened?"

It was wonderful to see and hear our crazy story through the eyes and ears of someone completely alien to it; to get a fresh view into the madness that is faith...whether it be faith in Christ and the Trinity, or Moses curing snakebite by showing a fake snake, Mohammed flying to Jerusalem in an instant and leaving a footprint in stone, or Siddhartha pouring fire and water from his body simultaneously. Some or all of these may seem completely nonsensical to us, but wars have been fought; lives --and indeed, nations--have been transformed; and great happiness has been born from abandoning all sense to the contrary and trusting in the power of God that is greater than ourselves.

I can't talk about other faiths reliably, but I do believe with my whole heart in our "March (to the cross and resurrection) Madness". I trust the witnesses to Christ I have read and journeyed with who have proved authentic; I trust the small resurrection experiences in my life, and I trust the goodness that I have been given. Goodness that does not originate with me, sinner that I am, but goodness that points me step by hesitant step in the direction of deepening faith, life and happiness. And I invite you to go crazy too and do things that will improve the lives and souls of yourself and others this March.


## Our Seminarian, Chad Pitman needs your help!



On February 24 Chad Wright-Pittman, an FPCNO member who is studying at Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta GA, was 'moved to candidacy' by our Presbytery on February 24. This means that he is in the next to the last stage before he is ordained as a minister in the Presbyterian Church. Most of his studies have been self funded, but he needs to raise \$1300 to pay for a very special class—in Hungary and the Czech Republic! Each 2nd year seminarian is supposed to explore ministry out of their comfort zone for a month. Students are sent as far away as South Africa and Korea for this

experience, and Chad was selected to be sent churches in Eastern Europe. While he is there he will be meeting with Christian leaders in the area, learning the history and culture of this part of the world and exploring the challenges and opportunities faced by the church in that region.

The Seminary pays the largest part of this class, but because of the travel involved, Chad is going to have to pay for his airfare and some other expenses. Are you ready for some FUNdraising!

It's hard to believe that the FUNdraising Committee has only been in existence for a little over six months. In that time we launched a successful effort to open our lot for Tulane home games (now that Yulman Stadium has opened a few blocks down Claiborne) and we partnered with the Waldorf School to sell Christmas Trees. The final numbers are coming in, but it looks like together both efforts made more than \$1,600. Not too shabby for our first year out.

After that flurry of activity, the committee took some time off but finally managed to get back together again (Thanks, Chris!) in late January. We brainstormed a lot of new ideas and we're currently looking into ways to utilize our space here at First for more rentals, considering ways to earn funds with some online tools, and we're finding new ways to promote weddings. We have literally dozens of other ideas that we hope to jump on as time permits.

Just last week, we submitted a grant application to Union Presbyterian Seminary that we hope will come out on top. It was for the Elinor Curry Award and is designed to help vital church ministries that "do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God." That's the very definition of our Program of Hope so we are optimistic that our application will find favor with the judging committee.

We've also started what we hope will become a viral campaign called "We're with First." The basic idea is to promote who we are – the diversity of people who attend and call this church home. After all, more people in the pews means more giving in the plate! That's what our fall stewardship campaign was all about (and we hope you remember the Bayou Home Companion from WFPC!). So if you are out and about, capture pictures of yourself and your families – in church, at a parade, at a festival, wherever you are to show that First Presbyterian members are everywhere.

We have set a regular schedule for our meetings – the last Saturday of the month at 9:00am in the Session Room. New energy and new ideas are ALWAYS welcome. Together, we can move mountains!

## What's up with the kitchen?

In November, we started the exciting process of renovating our once-decrepit kitchen. This Phase of the renovation included new plumbing, flooring, and electrical work. There have been a few snags in the process along with quite a few holidays but Project Homecoming has promised us that all work will be completed soon.





In detail, what's been done is:

- new plumbing throughout the kitchen
- replacement of old water heater with two new water 40 gallon water heaters that were placed in the attic
- new 3-compartment commercial sink
- hand washing sink
- new grease trap
- new sub floor
- installation of gorgeous ceramic tiles
- a floor drain near the sinks
- hookups for a commercial dishwasher (future item)
- keypad lock for the kitchen door and deadbolt lock for rear kitchen door
- repair of drywall damage in the right-side hallway of the stage

This is a great start and will give us a serviceable kitchen but we're not done yet! After the renovations are done, we (the church) will be doing some finishing touches like painting the cabinets and organizing everything.

Phase II would involve getting rid of our ancient stove, along with new appliances including a commercial refrigerator and freezer, ice maker, hood vent, etc. so that we'll finally have a full-fledged commercial kitchen.

Unfortunately, the day to day realities of keeping up an historic property and juggling community activities is difficult with a small congregation. The Presbytery's Committee on Ministry has been meeting with the Session for a year now in order to assist us with

our unique financial and personnel issues. In December, a Listening Team spent three evenings hearing the concerns of congregation members and friends. The Listening Team was genuinely impressed with the deep caring and commitment of those they met with and had these recommendations:

1) Form a personnel committee to determine the specific roles of the pastor, the office manager and sexton.

2) The Session and the pastor need to agree upon a common vision for FPC's long-term ministry and viability.

3) The church needs to front-end financial solvency information at every Session meeting.

As the Session, we have a duty to be careful financial stewards of the resources of First Presbyterian Church. The Session is deeply grateful to the **FUNdraising Committee**, who on their own initiative have begun meeting and following through on new fundraising ideas. We also created and tasked a **Budget Subcommittee of the Session** with reviewing our current income and expenses and making a recommendation for 2015. They are always looking for new friendly faces.
